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Dear Senator:

On behalf of more than one million members of the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF REALTORS®, I urge you to cosponsor S. 2250, "The Mortgage Forgiveness Tax Relief Act." This bipartisan legislation would extend the current law provisions that allow tax relief for homeowners when lenders forgive some portion of mortgage debt they owe. Securing this extension is among our highest priorities for 2012. In fact, REALTORS® will be seeking cosponsors to bills to extend this relief beyond 2012 when they are in Washington the week of May 14, 2012.

The objective of extending this provision is to assure that a homeowner in foreclosure, completing a short sale or attempting to have an existing loan restructured will not face an additional tax burden. If this provision is not extended, thousands of homeowners will pay income tax on "phantom income." They will owe tax on money they've already lost and will be required to pay that tax with cash they never received. The mortgage tax relief provisions protect these homeowners (so long as they meet specified criteria) from facing a tax bill after an economic loss on what, for most, is their most valuable asset.

Senators Stabenow and Heller have introduced S. 2250, a bipartisan bill to extend mortgage cancellation tax relief for two years, through December 31, 2014. In 2007, when the relief provision was enacted, no one would have dreamed that this tax relief would still be needed after 2012. Unfortunately, the crisis in the housing market has not yet resolved itself, so this relief provision will still be needed after 2012.

Currently over one quarter of all home sales involve a "distressed property," with many of these transactions taking months to complete. A strong signal is needed to provide certainty to both lenders and homeowners that they can continue to rely on the current rules as they structure these complex transactions. Timely enactment of this legislation is critical to the ongoing recovery of the housing market.

We hope you will join Senators Stabenow and Heller to cosponsor S. 2250.
