Dear Speaker Pelosi and Republican Leader Boehner:

On behalf of the Family Business Estate Tax Coalition (FBETC), we urge you to pass permanent estate tax reform legislation as soon as possible. The uncertainty of the current law has left many family-owned businesses and farms guessing about their estate tax liabilities and unable to make prudent business decisions.

The goal of the FBETC has always been full repeal of the estate tax, and we still believe this is the best solution to protect all family-owned businesses from the estate tax. While we understand that full repeal may not be possible in the current environment, the FBETC supports a permanent estate tax provision that would increase the exemption level to \$5 million and reduce the maximum rate to 35%.

It is also imperative that any permanent relief related to the exemption is indexed to inflation, provides for spousal transfer and includes stepped-up basis. Estate tax reform that includes these important components is critical for businesses and family farms that are struggling to create much needed jobs and expand their businesses.

The significant costs to plan for the estate tax reduces investment in business growth and job creation, and is only made worse by the current uncertainty surrounding the tax. Without a permanent solution, there are no assurances that these businesses and family farms will continue to operate in future generations.

Immediate, permanent estate tax relief is needed to ensure businesses can make sound economic decisions. We look forward to working with you to address this issue as soon as possible.
