Dear Chairman Ney and Chairman Bachus:

On behalf of nearly 1.2 million members of the National Association of REALTORS[®] (NAR) involved in all aspects of residential and commercial real estate, I would like to congratulate you on holding hearings on abusive mortgage lending practices. REALTORS[®] support your efforts to prevent lending practices that strip homeowners' equity and lead to loss of homes.

As you may know, the NAR Board of Directors approved a subprime and abusive lending report on May 14, 2005. This report takes a three pronged approach to address abusive lending practices. First, it builds on our existing public awareness campaign to talk to a REALTOR[®] first. Second, it encourages REALTORS[®] to help consumers become more financially literate and, in appropriate cases, refer them to reputable homebuyer and credit counseling organizations. And third, it recommends several legislative reforms to prevent abusive loans. Many of these reforms are included in bills now before your subcommittee.
