

Crystal Ball Senate Ratings Map



Senate

- Current composition is 51-49 Republican Majority
 - Two independents caucus with Democrats
- Democrats need to net two seats to win a majority
- A net gain of two requires Democrats to win 80% (28 of 35) of seats up for election
- 35 seats are up:
 - 26 are currently held by Democrats
 - 9 are held by Republicans



Senate

- 10 races are toss ups
- 2 races lean Democrat
- 2 race lean Republican
- 4 races are likely Democrat

- Arizona
- Florida
- North Dakota
- Nevada
- Indiana
- Missouri



Arizona

- No incumbent
- Republican: Rep. Martha McSally (R-AZ-2)
- Democrat: Rep. Kyrsten Sinema (D-AZ-9)
- Sinema appears to be leading
- Real Clear Politics Average: Sinema +1.5
- Reuters/Ipsos/University of Virginia Center for Politics:
 - Kyrsten Sinema (D) 47%, Martha McSally (R) 44%
- Trump Approval Rating: 45% approve 53% disapprove

Florida

- Incumbent: Sen. Bill Nelson (D-FL)
- Challenger: Gov. Rick Scott (R-FL)
- Polls show a dead heat
- Reuters/Ipsos/University of Virginia Center for Politics:
 - Rick Scott (R) 46%, Bill Nelson (D) 45%
- Trump Approval Rating: 47% approve 53% disapprove







Nevada

- Incumbent: Sen. Dean Heller (R-NV)
- Challenger: Rep. Jacky Rosen (D-NV-3)
- Reuters/Ipsos/University of Virginia Center for Politics:
 - Dean Heller (R) 46%, Jacky Rosen (D) 43%
 - This new data is more positive than other recent polling
- Trump Approval Rating: 49% approve 49% disapprove







Indiana

- Incumbent: Sen. Joe Donnelly (D-IN)
- Challenger: Former State Rep. Mike Braun
- NBC News/Marist has Donnelly up, leading 49%-43%
- "Indiana may be a slightly easier though still challenging hold for Democrats"







Missouri

- Incumbent: Sen. Claire McCaskill (D-MO)
- Challenger: Missouri Attorney General Josh Hawley (R)
- NBC New/Marist shows a total toss up: 47%-47%
 - The inclusion of a third party, however, gives McCaskill a 44%-40% edge







North Dakota



- Incumbent: Sen. Heidi Heitkamp (D-ND)
- Challenger: Rep. Kevin Cramer (R-ND-At Large)
- Crystal Ball ascertains that Heitkamp is trailing, and probably not just by a point or two
- Heitkamp does have good personal numbers which Democrats hope can translate into victory



Montana

- Incumbent: Sen. Jon Tester (D-MT)
- Challenger: State Auditor Matt Rosendale (R)
- Outlier polls do show Rosendale up 47%-45%
- There is a Libertarian candidate on the ballot








West Virginia

- Incumbent: Sen. Joe Manchin (D-WV)
- Challenger: Attorney General Patrick Morrisey (R)
- A poll from a group supporting Morrisey shows Manchin up by six points



Texas

- Incumbent: Sen. Ted Cruz (R-TX)
- Challenger: Rep. Beto O'Rourke (D-TX-16)



- Logic for "Lean Republican:" Hillary Clinton got within single digits of winning; given the current environment, O'Rourke could get closer than 9 points
- Reuters/Ipsos/University of Virginia Center for Politics:
 - Beto O'Rourke (D) 47%, Ted Cruz (R) 45%
- Sen. Ted Cruz (R-TX) leads by 4.5 points in the RCP Polling Average
- Trump Approval Rating: 47% approve 53% disapprove



Tennessee

- No incumbent
- Republican: Rep. Marsha Blackburn (R-TN-7)
- Democrat: Former Gov. Phil Bredesen (D)
- Most public polls show Bredesen up; Republicans have polls showing the opposite
- Republican trends in the state make this a heavy lift for Democrats

- Wisconsin
- Michigan

Ohio

- Incumbent: Sen. Sherrod Brown (D-OH)
- Challenger: Rep. Jim Renacci (R-OH-16)





New Jersey

- Incumbent: Sen. Bob Menendez (D-NJ)
- Challenger: Bob Hugin (R)
- A Quinnipiac poll has Menendez up by just 43%-37%





Wisconsin

- Incumbent: Sen. Tammy Baldwin (D-WI)
- Challenger: State Sen. Leah Vukmire (R)
- Holds lead of somewhere in the mid-to-high single digits





Michigan

- Incumbent: Sen. Debbie Stabenow (D-MI)
- Challenger: John James (R)





Overall Predictions


- Democrats would need to win eight of the ten Toss Ups/Leaners to win a majority
- Sabato's Crystal Ball gives that a less than 50-50 chance of that happening



House

- All 435 seats are up
- Current Composition: 241 Republicans to 194 Democrats
- Republicans have a 24-seat majority
- Thus, Democrats would need to pick up 24 seats to reach a majority of 218 seats
- The standard deviation of presidential party midterm seat loss is 27 seats

Toss Ups

- 40 Toss Ups (38 Republican held; 2 Democrat held)
- 19 Lean Democrat; 15 Lean Republican
- 14 Likely Democrat; 13 Likely Republican



Toss Ups

- California: 5 Toss Ups w/ Republican incumbents
- Texas: 3 Toss Ups with 2 Republican incumbents and 1 open seat
- New York: 3 Toss Ups w/ Republican incumbents
- Virginia: 3 Toss Ups w/ Republican incumbents
- Minnesota: 3 Toss Ups w/ two Democrat incumbents and 1 Republican incumbent


